Activities

Hungary-Japan Economic Club. He took president position in 2003, after losing many members of the club. With new kind of activities and better representation of the members' interest the club has been revitalized and the membership has been doubled. He created the home page for the club bringing quite an interest over the internet. The sessions of the club using the commercial diplomacy over the white table could take a good care of the Hungarian Japanese commercial relations. A newsletter on changes of the law has been distributed among the Japanese companies settled in Hungary for several years. The club with her members organized two competitions for the grammar school students on Japanese topics in 2005 and 2009 respectively attracting many participants. The competitions have got the right to use the official logo 2005 EU-Japan Cultural Exchange and Japan Danube Friendship Year 2009 respectively.

Hungary-Japan Friendship Society. He has been responsible for the home page of the society since 2002. He has been involved in most of the activities of the society as organizer and/or role player. He gave quite a few speeches about Japanese topics including sumo.

Academia Humana Foundation. The foundation is taking care of the cultural heritage of late sculptor Nándor Wagner who was a Japanese citizen and lived and created art pieces in Japan since 1969. The foundation has been giving financial support to university and grammar school students and small art groups both in Hungary and Romania and supports the research of the early Hungarian – Japanese contacts. The presentation of the group of statues named as *Garden of Philosophy* to Japan as a civil initiative was also supported by Academia Humana Foundation.
